As an old carol reminds us, Christmas is "the most wonderful time of the year." In ancient Rome, the weeklong festival of Saturnalia starting on December 17 was just as popular. The famed Roman poet Catullus went so far as to say that Saturnalia offered "the best of days."

Saturn was the Roman god of agriculture, seed, sowing, and time. Saturnalia began as a farmer's holiday to mark the end of the autumn planting season. Over time, the holiday evolved into a widely celebrated festival and moved later into the season, eventually coinciding with the winter solstice. The Temple of Saturn in Rome was the best place to celebrate Saturnalia. Rituals were performed to honor Saturn and ensure a good harvest. Some records indicate that the hollow statue of Saturn was filled to the brim with olive oil. The statue's feet were bound with woolen ties, which were loosened on Saturnalia to symbolically free the god.

Romans also freed themselves. Slaves were permitted to wear the *pileus*, the red felt cap denoting freedom. Businesses and courts were closed. Banquets and feasts were held throughout the week, and gifts of candles were exchanged so they could

be offered at the Temple of Saturn. Evergreen boughs were used as decorations, and tin ornaments were hung from trees and shrubs. Revelers wandered from door to door singing songs. Saturnalia was such a raucous affair that the author Pliny the Younger built a soundproof room to shield him from the noisy crowds.

Many cherished Christmas traditions were originally part of Saturnalia: gift-giving, decorating with evergreen boughs, lighting candles, and door-to-door caroling. Emperor Constantine may have converted to Christianity in AD 312, but Saturnalia celebrations continued into the next century. Slowly, as Christianity became the dominant religion, the traditions associated with Saturnalia were celebrated on Christmas Day, December 25, a date chosen nine months after Gabriel's Annunciation to Mary on March 25.

#### **How Did Christmas Start?**

The middle of winter has long been a time of celebration around the world. Centuries before the arrival of the man called Jesus, early Europeans celebrated light and birth in the darkest days of winter. Many peoples rejoiced during the winter solstice, when the worst of the winter was behind them and they could look forward to longer days and extended hours of sunlight.

#### **Who Invented Santa Claus?**



Illustrator Thomas Nast has been called the "Father of the American Cartoon" for the illustrations he featured in *Harper's Weekly* magazine in the 19th century. It was Nast who first used a donkey and elephant to symbolize America's political parties. He fought corruption with scathing political cartoons. But Nast's most enduring contribution to popular culture might be his depictions of Santa Claus as a jolly, fat man from the North Pole dressed in red and white.

Long before he was Santa Claus, he was Saint Nicholas, the Bishop of Myra, a fourth-century holy man renowned for the miracle of resurrecting three young boys killed by a butcher. For this remarkable feat, Saint Nicholas became the patron saint of children. Over the centuries, veneration of Saint Nicholas would spread. The Dutch called him Sinterklaas, and when the Dutch set sail for the New World in

the 17th century, they brought Sinterklaas with them.

Sinterklaas, or Santa Claus, and Christmas, were well-established in America by the 1800s. But in December of 1823, Clement Clark Moore published his poem '*Twas the Night Before Christmas*, and first described Santa Claus not as an austere bishop, but "chubby and plump, a right jolly old elf." Charles Dickens then published *A Christmas Carol* in 1843, transforming Christmas from a religious holiday into a popular and commercial extravaganza. By January of 1863, with the United States plunged into Civil War, Thomas Nast had plenty of inspiration for his first cartoon depicting Santa Claus.

Nast's first depictions of Santa portray him not just as a jolly old elf but as an ally of the Union Army, and he used his own long beard as inspiration for Santa's flowing white one. Over the next 23 years, Nast would make 33 illustrations of Santa, none more influential than his 1881 image of "Merry Old Santa Claus," complete with a white beard, rosy cheeks, red suit, and pack full of toys. This image, more than any other, has made Santa Claus who he is today.

#### The Power of Gratitude

Being grateful has been linked to health benefits such as improved mood, better sleep, and more satisfying relationships. Thank You Note Day on December 26 offers us a chance to use the power of gratitude. Researchers recently explored how writing thank-yous increases one's sense of well-being. Writers of thank-you notes often feel nervous about the task. They worry that they will not be able to find the right words or that the recipients of their notes would feel awkward or surprised to receive a letter.

But these worries are completely unfounded. Recipients of thank-you notes are almost always grateful. In fact, recipients find thank-you notes to be warmer and more articulate than the writers expect. As long as the intentions of the writer are sincere and heartfelt, the contents of the note are always well received. Researchers believe that thank-you notes are prosocial; that is, they are an important type of social glue linking people together. Self-consciousness should never stand in the way of giving



thanks. So, let us express our gratitude to the researchers for conducting their experiment.

#### **BINGO'S BIRTHDAY MONTH – December**

Bingo's Birthday Month celebratedin December. You know the game that you probably loved playing with your grandparents and other family members growing up? Well, now's its birthday Month! The game began in Italy in 1530 as "LoGiuoco del Lotto

D'Italia," and is still played there today, almost every Saturday. The French adopted the game in the 1770s as "Le Lotto." Germany put an academic spin on the pastime a century later turning it into an educational game for children, tying in lessons on various subjects.

Bingo arrived in North America in 1929, where it was first called "beano." Edwin Lowe, a New York salesman, modernized the game by hiring mathematician Carl Leffler, who developed thousands of combinations of numbered game cards. Lowe reportedly changed the name to "Bingo" when a winner shouted the word one day by mistake.

A Catholic priest approached Lowe in the thirties about using Bingo as a church fundraiser, thus kicking off the decades-long association of the game with the American Catholic community. The game is also popular in casinos, though casino Bingo has declined in many areas due to rising taxes, smoking bans, and the rise of online gaming.

And here's a fun fact for you: Edwin Lowe, the man who modernized Bingo, also invented Yahtzee!
